

## New Terminal Facts at a Glance

The new Cherry Capital Airline Terminal Complex is approximately 115,000 square feet. The facility is approximately 1,000 acres, and is located on South Airport Road, between South Garfield Avenue and Three Mile Road.

The new terminal complex incorporates Northern Michigan design features along with an infusion of Arts and Crafts/Frank Lloyd Wright architectural elements.

Cherry Capital Airport will be only the ninth airport in the United States to have a new state-of-the-art fully integrated baggage handling & screening system as designed by the Department of Homeland Security.

The Terminal Complex will employ a modern security tracking system and soon will incorporate one of the first biometrics access systems.

Cherry Capital Airport is the primary air carrier airport for Northwestern Lower Michigan with service provided by Northwest Airlines, Northwest Airlink, Delta, American Eagle, and United Express.

Cherry Capital Airport boasts direct flights to Chicago, Detroit, Minneapolis, and seasonally to New York.

Cherry Capital Airport connects travelers to over 750 domestic and international destinations conveniently and economically.

The airline terminal development started ten years ago with research and design phases. Construction began November of 2001.

The facility is designed by Reynolds, Smith and Hills, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida.

A new Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting building, and a new facility to house snow removal equipment.

The total cost for the new terminal complex is approximately 54 million dollars. The project carries no debt, without bonds attached or millage sought.
